

To combat the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, the Republic of Panama has enacted new regulations to stop the spread and guarantee the continuance of economic activities.

Government declares National State of Emergency

The Panamanian government approved **on March 13, 2020, Cabinet Resolution No. 11** which declares national state of emergency and allows the Executive Branch to take special actions in combatting the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. The following regulations have been issued as part of the National Strategy Against Covid-19:

Economic and Commercial Reactivations
